What's New in the Hobby? – May 2019 by Brendan Hogan

This month's "What's New" column features a number of exciting releases from John Jenkins Designs, Thomas Gunn Miniatures, and King & Country. My picks of the batch from JJD are the additions to the Battle of Saratoga series. My particular favourites are a mounted Colonel Daniel Morgan (\$125.98 CAD) and an officer carrying the National Colour of the Continental Army's 1st Canadian Regiment (\$84.83 CAD). Colonel Morgan commanded the elite Morgan's Riflemen, a light infantry unit that .

used rifles instead of the standard musket. The 1st Canadian Regiment was one of the few units in the Continental Army that had a national rather than state affiliation. Despite its name, a significant number of recruits came from Pennsylvania and other states. My favourite new figure from TGM is also a flagbearer - a Russian Pavlovski grenadier from the Napoleonic Wars (\$73.56 CAD). If you look closely, you can see that this grenadier has suffered a serious injury to his knee. National Color. This figure is limited to 100 in quantity, so order soon if you'd like to add this piece to your collection. K&C has produced a mounted figure of the Duke of Wellington (\$172.43 CAD). The Iron Duke needs no introduction, but K&C had captured





Nosey's likeness perfectly. K&C has also delved into the Scottish Wars of Independence releasing two knight figures: Sir William Wallace and Sir Archibald Douglas (\$172.43 CAD each). Both figures are sculpted in combat poses and the heraldry on them is spectacular. K&C opted for a more realistic depiction of Wallace than his portrayal in the Mel Gibson *Braveheart* movie.

"Show & Tell" Presentations: - The topic for this month's "Show & Tell" was "Mint in Box". Many members trotted out their favourite figures or boxed sets. Outstanding was Doug Cope's 1950's Britain's Coronation Coach Set. Juan Lopez decided it was Anti-tank night and brought out a great collection of 1/6 scale WW2 anti-tank rifles (all without boxes as he designed and 3d printed all the guns himself). Our 1/6 guys excelled with a nice "Indiana Jones vs Nazis" vibe diorama. The "Mint in Box" topic was well hidden (a 1/6 scale box in the diorama contained a1/1 scale package of mints).

The meeting wrapped up with the usual buying, selling, trading, and conversations.

The next meeting of OMSS Ottawa is Tuesday May 28 ... the Show & Tell theme is "Machine Guns".

6th - Wargame Figures (14 points)

(The 11 other types of figures categories received 9 or less points each.)

1st - WW2 (65 points)

2nd - Napoleonic Era (43 points)

3rd - WW1 (40 points)

4th - Victorian Wars (34 points)

5th - Seven Years War (25 points)

6th - Medieval (19 points)

OMSS May Meeting Guest Lecturer – Don Down

Don Down is a member of the Central Ontario Branch of the Western Front Association. Founded in Great Britain in 1980 the Western Front Association seeks to perpetuate the memory, courage and comradeship of those of all sides who served their countries in France and Flanders and their own countries during the Great War. Don and his wife Mary joined the Association after the diary of Mary's great uncle Private William Leo Meagher was returned to Canada by an American relative Dorothy Sherwood. Leo Meagher served with the 44th Battalion and the 10th Machine Gun Company during the First World

War and was killed on April 10th, 1917 at the Battle of Vimy Ridge. Don and Mary are currently working on a companion to Leo's diary.

Since his retirement from the field of social work in 2014, Don has written and led historical tours in the Peterborough area and has appeared on local television. Don also collects model soldiers. His modest collection reflects an enduring interest in Canadian military history. Don will speak on the Peterborough connection to what W. Britain has called "The War Along the Nile."
